


# How to see what your users have done

The [auditing](#) function via *Statistics > Auditing* will tell you about the important actions that have happened across your organisation.

For more detailed information about an individual account you can look at the activity tab on that account's detail page. You can jump to the account's details page from the audit page by clicking the account username.
